Earn college transfer credits at BYU–Hawaii before you graduate from high school

To apply for concurrent enrollment at Brigham Young University–Hawaii, you must complete the admissions application (fee waived) on apply.lds.org and submit it with a concurrent enrollment voucher. A new voucher and application must be submitted for each enrollment period. All credits earned as a concurrent student will also be counted as college transfer credits.

Applicants for concurrent enrollment must:

- Have completed at least one quarter of their junior year of high school
- Have a score of 22+ ACT or 980+ SAT
- Have an unadjusted cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.20+
- Agree to enroll for no more than 7 hours of university credits during any semester
- Understand that registration begins one month before the start of the semester
- Have unconditional support (i.e. early release approval) to attend BYUH as a concurrent student
- Complete and submit the concurrent enrollment voucher with necessary signatures from a parent and counselor
