What is the BYU-Hawaii Hukilau Domestic Workstudy Program?

The **Hukilau Domestic Workstudy Program** assists qualified students who come from under-represented populations who are economically disadvantaged, immigrants, refugees or first generation college students to obtain a quality education at BYU-Hawaii. It is built on the principle of self-reliance where students learn personal responsibility and accountability by working and contributing financially to their education. The goal of the program is to provide necessary financial assistance to worthy member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints so they can return home debt-free, qualified and prepared to provide leadership in the Church, in civic and social affiliations and within their families.

Benefits of the BYU-Hawaii Domestic WorkStudy Program

- Graduate debt-free from BYU-Hawaii in 9 semesters
- Receive assistance to pay tuition, class fees, student medical benefit and room and board above the calculated amount of the student financial contribution each semester
- Develop personal habits of hard work, thrift, perseverance and leadership that will be used in the work place

Program Requirements

- Qualify for admission to BYU-Hawaii for entry to any semester
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 or better and earn at least 14 credits each semester while on campus
- Work 19 hours each week during the semester and 40 hours each week during breaks on campus or at the Polynesian Cultural Center. Travel is limited.
- Each semester the student contributes toward the cost of attendance from the combination all available sources such as scholarships, grants, the federal Pell Grant, Native Hawaiian, or tribal Native American scholarships, part-time employment on campus or at PCC and Hukilau WorkStudy funds
- Students promise to follow the principles outlined in the Honor Code and renew their ecclesiastical endorsement each year
- Maintain good health in order to study and participate in the program
- Live on campus in the first semester and approved university housing in subsequent semesters
- Graduate within 9 semesters in residence
- Agree not to own a vehicle while enrolled at the university
